THE ART OF SUMMER - SALTBOX GALLERY SHOW A SUCCESS



Reservation Terrace Update

The erosion at Reservation Terrace continues to be a problem. The road is partially washed out and covered with sand, threatening emergency response access to neighborhood homes in the event of a fire or medical issue. Also, the City water/sewer lines will be adversely impacted if the erosion continues and completely washes

out the road. Some progress has been made to temporarily secure the area. Sand accumulated from several storms was cleaned out from under and around homes at the end of 75th Street and along part of Reservation Terrace (at the homeowners' expense) and piled up along the shore to help prevent further erosion. Also, the torn giant plastic sandbags debris has been removed and the toppled cement blocks at the end of 73rd Street have been put back in place by City workers.



A short-term plan is still being considered to dredge sand from the Captain's Fishing docks at Plum Island Point and place it onshore at the Reservation Terrace river beach, but the permitting process is expensive and long.

The good news is that the United States Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) is on track for Fall 2021 with the Newburyport Harbor Federal Navigation Project (FNP) for maintenance dredging of the Merrimack River and placement of dredged material on the inlet beach of Plum Island's North Point (also known as the "North Point 204 Project Partnership Agreement"). The plan also includes placement of dredged

material at two near shore placement locations - one off Salisbury Beach and the other off Plum Island Beach. The final plan design may change, but the project has been approved. The link to the January 29, 2021 Public Notice is: www.nae.usace.army.mil

We have all seen a lot of building on Plum island over the years, but there has been a completely different type of construction going on over the past fifteen years in a small workshop in the home of Joe Cmar of Reservation Terrace.

With a background in civil engineering and construction, in his later years, Joe became interested in constructing dioramas of local buildings and landscapes.

He needs no heavy equipment or pile drivers, just plenty of balsa wood, heavy weight paper, styrofoam and plaster to construct these detail-oriented table top replicas of local businesses and places of interest including: the Pink House; Surfland; Pl Lighthouse; The Cottage and the docks at the Point including the Captains Fishing party boats, just to name just a few.

MOBI-Mats On Plum Island

A long-time project the Plum Island Taxpayers and Associates (PITA) has sponsored is placing Mobi-mats on ocean beach access pathways. The purpose of these mats is two-fold: to protect the dunes and also to make it easier for residents and visitors to reach the beach. The Mobi-mats in the following locations are owned and maintained by PITA and were paid for by generous donations from our membership as well as PITA fundraising efforts:

- 53rd Street Beach Access
- 57th Street Beach Access
- Northern Boulevard Beach Access (across from Mad Martha's)
- Reservation Terrace at 73rd Street River Access
- Harvard Way Beach Access (off Southern Boulevard)





Additional Mobi-mats have been installed by DCR (the MA Department of Conservation & Recreation) providing access to the Merrimack River Beach over the North Reservation dunes, which is land owned by DCR.

In addition to the Mobi-mats, PITA sponsored the Plum Island Point Boardwalk to the Merrimack River dedicated in June 2005. This Boardwalk was erected in conjunction with local, community and federal funding and support. The Boardwalk is open, but unfortunately, there is currently no beach access from the gazebo... only River and ocean views due to severe erosion at Plum Island Point. (See Reservation

PLUM ISLAND LIGHT (NEWBURYPORT HARBOR LIGHT)

Originally erected in 1788, two small lighthouses were located at the entrance of the Merrimack River on Plum Island. The lighthouses were moved often because of the shifting sands and changing channel. Plum Island Light was designated the 11th lighthouse on the North Atlantic

Coast and the 13th in America. In 1898, the white conical lighthouse you see today was built and then automated in 1951 so lighthouse keepers were no longer needed. In 2000, the United States Coast Guard deeded the lighthouse to the City of Newburyport who in turn transferred the lease to The Friends of Plum Island Light, Inc. Prior to 2020, the Friends kept the lighthouse open on weekends for public and private tours. To keep volunteers

and visitors safe, the Lighthouse was closed during the pandemic and has not yet reopened because the limited space inside the tower does not permit adequate social distance for tours. They hope to reopen in 2022. During the closure, the Friends have continued vital maintenance including renovating the inside of the tower, refabricating and replacing all broken panes of glass. Maintenance of the lighthouse is costly and fully funded by private donations. All are invited to become members, purchase commemorative bricks, or send donations to Friends of Plum Island Light at PO Box 381, Newburyport MA 01950. 
